

Facts & Figures

Key facts

- South Africa have scored 995 points since PETER De VILLIERS took over as Head Coach and need five points on Saturday to reach 1,000 in his 38th test match with the Springboks.
- MORNE STEYN needs just one more point to reach 300 in test internationals, having scored 299 in just 23 appearances. He would become only the third South African to achieve that landmark after Percy Montgomery and Naas Botha.
- MORNE STEYN is also just two points behind Dan Carter of New Zealand in the race to be the leading scorer in 2010, with 162 points scored in 11 matches played.
- South Africa have won 74% of matches played when BAKKIES BOTHA has been involved but only 36% of matches without him since he made his debut in November 2002.
- VICTOR MATFIELD and BAKKIES BOTHA hold the record for the number of international test appearances as a second row combination. This will be the 59th time they have played together for South Africa, having won 44 and lost 14.
- The Springboks have won the last seven matches against Scotland, with their last defeat coming at Murrayfield in November 2002, when they lost 21-6.

Team news

- Scotland have made five personnel changes to their starting line up from the team that lost 49-3 to New Zealand last weekend, with SCOTT MacLEOD coming in at lock forward, NATHAN HINES at flanker, RORY LAWSON, who replaces Mike Blair at scrum half and captains the side in his absence, JOE ANSBRO at outside centre and NIKKI WALKER returns on the wing.
- South Africa have made four personnel changes to their starting line up from last weekend's win over Wales, with RYAN KANKOWSKI coming in at number eight, FRANCOIS HOUGAARD at scrum half, LWAZI MVOVO on the wing and ZANE KIRCHNER at full back in place of GIO APLON, who moves to the right wing.

Springboks domination

- South Africa have now won 15 out of 18 matches played against northern hemisphere opposition under Head Coach, PETER De VILLIERS. The three defeats came against the British and Irish Lions in 2009 when South Africa had already won the series and against France and Ireland on last year's European tour.
- The Springboks have won the last seven matches against Scotland, with their last defeat coming at Murrayfield in November 2002, when they lost 21-6. That is the only win for Scotland in the last 12 matches between the sides dating back to 1969.

The man in the middle

- STUART DICKINSON of Australia will be in charge of this match. This will be the sixth time he has officiated in an international involving Scotland, who have won three and lost two, although the last match was in March 2006 against Ireland, who won 15-9 at Dublin in the Six Nations Championship.
- It will be the 11th time that Dickinson has officiated in a South Africa test match and the Springboks do not have a good record with this referee, having won three and lost seven, including the last four. The most recent game was the third test against the British and Irish Lions in July 2009, which South Africa lost 28-9 in Johannesburg.

On this day in history

- South Africa lost 32-16 to England at Twickenham on 20 November 2004, the only time the Springboks have played on this date in their 107 year test match history. BAKKIES BOTHA, VICTOR MATFIELD and JEAN De VILLIERS all started in that match.
- On the same day Scotland were losing 31-17 to Australia in Glasgow.

Murrayfield

- This is Scotland's 238th match at Murrayfield having won 120, lost 107 and drawn 10.
- South Africa have played 14 matches at Murrayfield, winning 11 and losing 3.

Top 10 points in a calendar year

- MORNE STEYN is the second highest points scorer in test match rugby in 2010 with 162 and is averaging over 14 points per test match. He is just two points behind Dan Carter of New Zealand in the race to be the leading scorer in 2010 and needs just six points to move into the top 10 points scorers of all time in a single calendar year.

SCOTLAND FACTS AND FIGURES

Losing experiences

- There are 13 members of the Scotland starting line up that have previous experience of playing test rugby against South Africa for their country and they have only won two out of 37 matches between them.
- ROSS FORD did come on as a replacement for the British and Irish Lions side that beat South Africa 28-9 in Johannesburg in July 2009.

Three winners

- NATHAN HINES, NIKKI WALKER and CHRIS PATERSON, who starts on the replacements bench, are the only three players in the squad to experience a Scotland victory over South Africa and they are also the only three players to score a try against the Springboks. WALKER's try came in the 2002 victory at Murrayfield.

Record holder

- CHRIS PATERSON has made 100 test appearances for Scotland and scored 752 points, both of which are records for his country. He needs two more tries to equal Tony Stanger and Ian Smith, who are the leading try scorers in Scottish test rugby history with 24 each.

Front row record

- The front row combination of ALLAN JACOBSEN, ROSS FORD and EUAN MURRAY will equal the Scottish record for starting the most games as a unit (Won 6, Drawn 1 and Lost 8). The current record of 16 starts is held by 2 combinations - David Sole, Kenny Milne & Paul Burnell (Won 10, Drawn 1 and Lost 5) and Iain Milne, Colin Deans & Jim Aitken (Won 9, Drawn 2 and Lost 5).

Debutant

- JOE ANSBRO makes his debut for Scotland this weekend after Max Evans failed to recover from a shoulder injury sustained against New Zealand last weekend.

SOUTH AFRICA FACTS AND FIGURES

Captain Vic

- VICTOR MATFIELD became the most capped player in South African test history last weekend. This will be his 14th game as captain of the Springboks, who have won nine and lost four under his leadership.
- MATFIELD has played against Scotland seven times and has been on the winning side on each occasion.

Points machine

- MORNE STEYN needs just one more point to reach 300 in test internationals, having scored 299 in just 23 appearances. He would become only the third South African to achieve that landmark after Percy Montgomery and Naas Botha.

Key influence

- South Africa have won 74% of matches played when BAKKIES BOTHA has been involved but only 36% of matches without him since he made his debut in November 2002.

1,000 approaching

- South Africa have scored 995 points since PETER De VILLIERS took over as Head Coach and need five points on Saturday to reach 1,000 in his 38th test match with the Springboks.

Race to a century

- JEAN De VILLIERS needs one more try to reach 100 points in international test match rugby.
- FRANCOIS STEYN needs three more points to reach 100 in test matches.

Try harder

- No players in the South Africa squad have scored a try against Scotland in 34 appearances between them, although none of the starting line up have experienced defeat at the hands of this weekend's opponents.

Fond memories

- JUAN SMITH made his debut against Scotland in June 2003 and is unbeaten in six matches against them.

Not so fond memories

- CJ van der LINDE is one of two players on the replacements bench who were involved in the defeat to Scotland in November 2002, when he made his debut in a Springbok shirt as a late replacement. ADI JACOBS also played in that match.

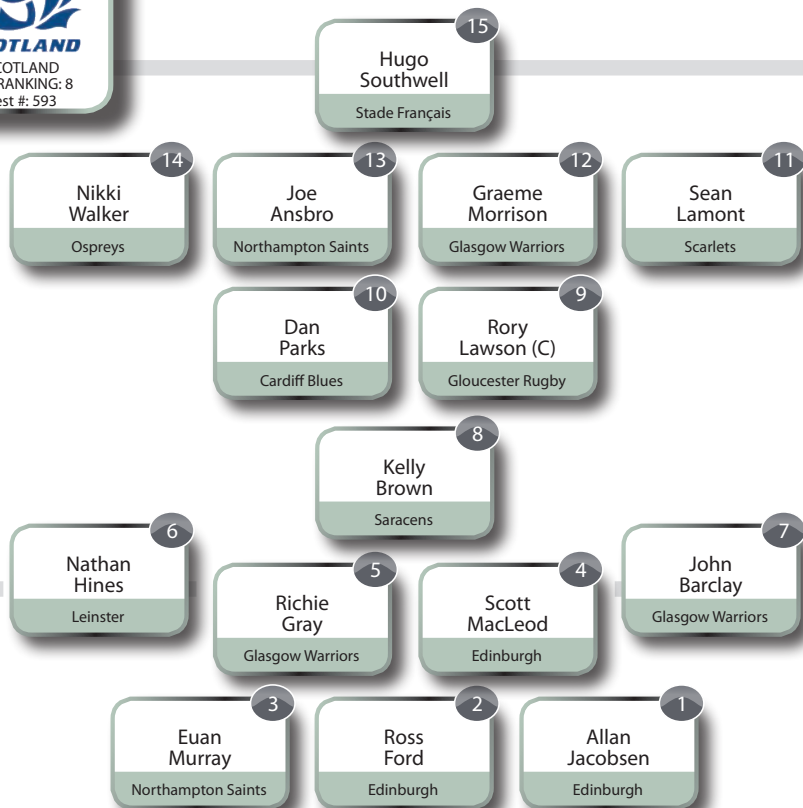
Birthday boy

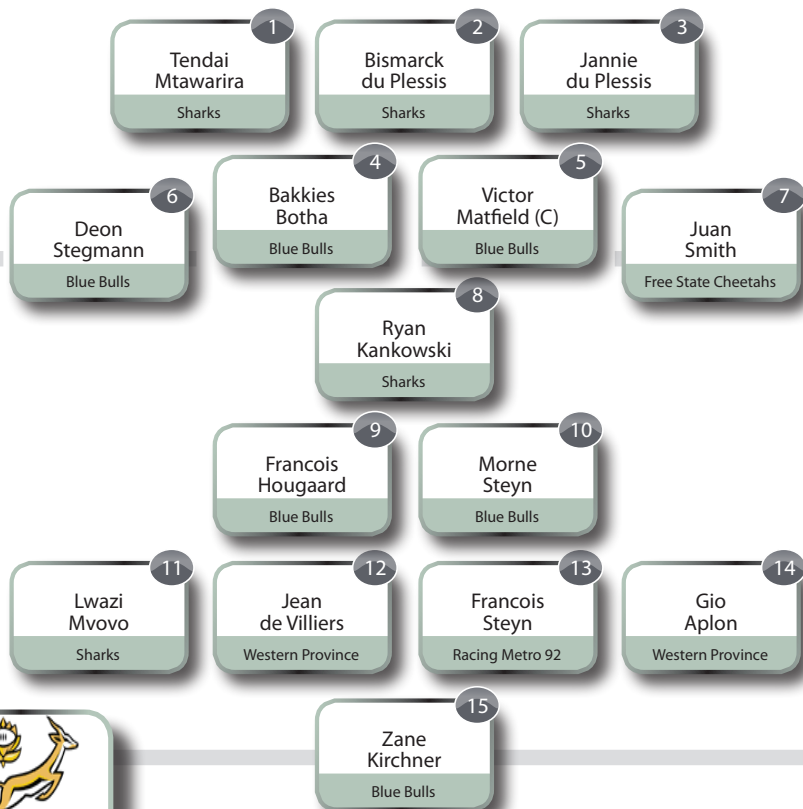
